We have a busy five days of creativity ahead of us at Nenagh Arts Centre and on the streets of Nenagh. Spleodar 2024 features a selection of fun, stimulating and exciting workshops, performances and spectacles over the Halloween mid-term.

Where imagination meets ice... watch in awe as David Walsh transforms a metre high block of ice into an ice sculpture to captivate your imagination.




Come together to celebrate the spirit of the season with costumes, lights and music.
