Our annual spooktacular event, now in its 26th incarnation.

Spleodar 2025 will bring shadows to life and turn Nenagh into a cauldron of mystery and magic. Witches will whisper, ghosts may giggle, and jack-o'-lanterns will light your path as the town fills with music, laughter, and just a hint of mischief around candlelit corners and down eerie alleyways. Watch out for things that go bump in the night.

And remember—listen closely to the sounds around you. ÉIST!

Expect the unexpected: strange sights, curious sounds, and spine-tingling surprises lurking around every corner. You might stumble upon Rogu's fire performance outside Nenagh's Gaol, a fiery fusion of circus, dance, martial arts, and magic. Or follow a ghoulish treasure haunt through the town's historic sites. Perhaps you'll dance with skeletons under the moonlit sky, or go Garden Bathing in the Castle Gardens, listening to a haunted soundscape and creating spooky sounds under the flickering lantern light. And don't miss Far Flung Trio in Nenagh Arts Centre's Theatre—a dizzying, uplifting musical experience for all the family to open this year's Halloween Festival.

This year's festival is brimming with tricks and treats for all ages. Children can conjure up crafts and join **spooky workshops**, while the bravest of souls may dare to venture into chilling performances, haunted happenings, and spectral spectacles. Try your hand at **Stop Motion Animation**, Weirdy **Witch and Wizard Workshops**, or **Mask Painting. Craft a mandala**, a festive wreath, or a paper-and-bamboo lantern—or simply settle in to listen to **ghostly stories**. Together, we'll celebrate the magic of imagination, the joy of community, and the thrill of a good Halloween scare—culminating in a fantastical **fireworks display** on the grounds of CBS this Halloween Night.

In September, Aosdána member Áine Ní Ghlinn worked with local primary school children to create poetry inspired by £1STI—their words will be on exhibition in NAC during the festival. Nengh Youth Theatre's Calvin Magee has been conjuring £1stigí, £1stigí with David Noonan. Meanwhile, Ellen Finnerty and Hug Casals have been busy running lantern—making workshops for Garden Bathing in the Castle Gardens and for the Halloween Parade.
